Masks and other stuff

Covid in Decatur Area

For 5 weeks in a row, Macon County had less than 20 new Covid cases. The last four weeks, there have been 31 new cases (Jul 9th), 22 (jul 16), then 52 (jul 23), then 61 new cases as of July 29th (6 days since last update)

Of 104,712 people, only 38.88% of residents are vaccinated. About 60,000 people in Macon County are unvaccinated.

On July 9th, the MC Health Dept reported 1 delta variant. On July 27th, they reported 5. In this time, we have 3 new cases of the Brazil P.1.1 variant.

In Illinois, 644 fully vaccinated people have been hospitalized due to COVID. Since Jan 1, 2.44% of all IL COVID deaths have been among fully vaccinated folks.

109,888 vaccine doses have gone unused in IL.

You go in. Maybe you stand in line a minute. You get a shot in your arm. You sit for 15 minutes as with all vaccines. You go home. You come back for your 2nd dose in 3 or 4 weeks if its an mRna vaccine.
